conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. <sup>23</sup>Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. <sup>24</sup>And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, <sup>25</sup>not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

## Holy Gospel: Mark 13:1-13



But the one who endures to the end will be saved."

**DOLLAR FOR MISSIONS** contributions are now being devoted to necessary infrastructure at University Lutheran Church in Champaign (UniLu). New toilets will be installed in a men's room, and a new water heater installed for the building.

"Items like these seem far from glamorous," said CID Mission Executive Ken Schurb. "They do not capture our senses until problems arise in connection with them. Then their importance stands out." He added that plumbing as well as painting and many other such "background" elements help UniLu offer Christ in Word and Sacrament to University of Illinois students, faculty, and staff.

On October 24, CID President Michael Mohr declared complete the previous DFM project, which had been furnace replacements at Immanuel Lutheran Student Center in Macomb. This project ended up requiring only about half of the \$25,000 originally set aside for it.

The Macomb furnace project was the last on the list approved by CID Board of Directors for this year. Under discretionary authority within guidelines that this board adopted for DFM, Pres. Mohr opened the current project to address known needs at UniLu.

For the third consecutive year, CID mission stations have been assembling a list of their projected repair and upgrades for the next 10 years. "The list makes it easy to look up needs at CID mission properties," Pres. Mohr said. District congregations will see the total updated list prior to next summer's CID convention. **Amount to be funded:\$5,000. Project:** Replace toilets in basement men's restroom and replace water heater at University Lutheran Church, Champaign

# "Enduring in Faith in the True Christ"

Grace, mercy and peace be yours from God our Father through faith in the Lord Jesus

Christ.

As we near the end of the church year our focus naturally shifts to the End Times, which both today's readings from Daniel and Mark deal with. St. Mark records events on Tuesday of holy week, when Jesus leaves the Jerusalem temple for the last time and later that evening responds to their questions concerning its destruction which He spoke of as well as the end of the world, which they, understandably though incorrectly, assumed would be at the same time.

And so Jesus mentions some of those signs that will indicate the end of this age; most of which we have come to know fairly well: wars and rumors of wars, natural disasters, hatred and persecution of Christians, even betrayal of believers by their own closest loved ones because they are disciples of Christ. Yet, even as these *are* signs of the end, we must not forget Jesus' words concerning them, "These are but the beginning of the birth pains." Truly, these signs have been on the earth since the Fall into sin and have only increased since then and surely they will, as a whole, continue only to intensify until our Lord returns on the Last Day because we have entered the End Times with His first coming. That is why St. Paul could refer to his current generation as those "on whom the end of the ages has come."

Dear fellow saints, if those first century Christians to whom Paul wrote in AD 55 were already in the end of the ages, then how much more are we, in 2024, even further into them? How much closer to our Lord's return are we today than they were then? For while we do not know when the Day of the Lord will be, we can be very sure of one thing: every day that passes, every single day of our own short lives, brings us one day closer to it.

And that's a critical factor as we reflect on our Lord's response to His disciples' question about the signs and times. Jesus doesn't avoid answering the question, but He answers it in a manner according to divine wisdom. That is, He answers not to satisfy their fleshly curiosity, but instead to work in them spiritual preparedness. He gives them the necessary warnings and cautions so that, recognizing the signs of the End, they would neither be surprised at what occurs nor lose their faith due to them, especially the suffering they would face, but would instead endure them in constant faith and certain hope of final vindication and victory when He returns. And His answer was recorded in Sacred Scripture so that we too would be prepared, not with guns, food stocks, and shelters, for

these will not help, but spiritual ready in true faith in Christ.

"See that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he!' and they will lead many astray." Note what our Lord draws our attention to, not the wars or disasters, not the persecutions, for these are but signs to be noted. No, the signs are not to be our focus, but seeing them our focus is to be on Christ Jesus all the more, which means the greatest danger is not natural calamities, wars, or persecution, but anything that would lead us astray, away from Christ. Thus, while not as dramatic to our eyes and minds, false teaching is the greatest threat to us, for it attacks not our body, but our soul, leading not to mere physical death, but spiritual death, eternal suffering of both body and soul. That is the real danger!

False teaching comes from false teachers, whom Jesus warns against numerous times, referring to them as ravenous wolves in sheep's clothing on another occasion. Some, over the millennia, have actually claimed to be the promised Christ. More commonly, the false prophet won't profess to be Christ directly, but by claiming to speak for He who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, yet then adjusting, changing, and contradicting His teachings as recorded in the Bible, they become false Christs. Finally, there are those who, even if they deny Christ, still maintain that they speak with either divine authority, as we see in false religions, cults, spiritual movements, and occult practices or, if not really spiritual, they claim a higher, even absolute authority, such as found in atheistic humanism, materialistic evolution, as well as Marxism and other human philosophies that claim to have the answers for anyone smart enough to listen.

Yes, Jesus warns about being led astray from Him as He alone is God's incarnate Son. He alone is mankind's savior. He is our substitute, born under the Law to obey it perfectly and give to us His righteousness, born under the Law to bear our sins even unto death and hell upon the cross that, so that through faith in Him we might be forgiven all our sins and be perfectly righteous in Him. Consider then, how false teaching leads astray, away from Christ Jesus.

Any denial of the Trinity or of the full divinity and full humanity of Jesus presents a false Christ, one who cannot save us. For if He is not true man, His life, sacrifice, and resurrection are meaningless, as a fake man cannot save real people. And if He is not true God, then no matter if how sinless He was, His sacrifice, however noble, would be impotent to save anyone else.

Yet, there are more subtle false teachings. Jesus did His part, now you do yours. But a Jesus whose work must be finished by us, whether through numerous good works or as "simple" as choosing Him as our personal Lord and Savior, is a Jesus who lied to us on the cross when He said "It is finished!" Either it is finished, or it isn't. Jesus said it is! Anyone who says it isn't by calling upon you to complete His work in any way proclaims a false Christ.

Anyone who takes "Baptism now saves you" to mean anything other than that the

Sacrament of Holy Baptism actually and truly works forgiveness of sins, new life, and eternal salvation, proclaims a false Christ. Anyone who proclaims Jesus' body and blood are sacrificed again in the Eucharist, or that His body and blood are not really present but merely symbolized, proclaims a false Christ, for Jesus said that His body and blood, once for all sacrificed on the cross, are given to be eaten and drunk in the Holy Communion for the forgiveness of sins. Anyone who teaches that saving faith can be sustained, will persevere through time, trial, and temptation apart from hearing the Word of Christ, voluntarily choosing to avoid the gathering of believers around Word and Sacrament in the Divine Service, proclaims a false Christ.

Anyone who says that Jesus died only for some but not all and so leave you in fear He might not have died for you proclaims a false Christ. Anyone who says Jesus died for all so everyone will be saved no matter what they believe or how they live proclaims a false Christ. Anyone who declares that some sins are just too terrible for the blood of Christ to wash away, proclaims a false Christ. Anyone who asserts that a believer in Jesus can do what they think or feel is best instead of following God's will revealed in the Bible and summarized in the Ten Commandments, or who teaches repentance does not include turning from sin and changing their sinful ways, but that a believer can choose to return to sin or willingly continue in sin and still have saving faith proclaims a false Christ.

All of these are different, some even contradictory, which proves that the opposite of a lie is not the truth, *but the opposite lie*. But since all false teachings, whatever the specifics, are false, that is, *they are lies*, they all proclaim a false Christ and so would lead a Christian away the true Christ, Jesus. The same Jesus who says, "The one who endures to the end will be saved."

This can sound rather scary as we consider the various trials and sufferings of the End Times. But what with man is impossible is possible for our Triune God. The Father has given to us His Son who by His cross has saved us from our sins, crushed the devil underneath His nail scarred feet, and overcome the hostile world of tribulation and persecution for us, His redeemed people. We have been baptized into Christ Jesus, united to Him, fed on His very body and blood, and so He is our strength, our endurance.

But there are so many false teachings and teachers that Satan uses to lead us astray. How can we know the true Christ from the false? Again, our God takes care of us! The Holy Spirit enlightens our sin-darkened hearts and minds by shining the light of Christ into our souls through His Word which is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. The Bible teaches all that we need to know in order to be saved, showing us our sins, our total inability to save ourselves, and our precious Savior, Jesus, crucified for our sins, raised for our justification. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit enlightens us to know Christ from antichrists, true teaching from false teaching, true faith from false faith, good and holy works from works of self-righteousness. More, He empowers us to endure to the end in faith in Christ and to remain faithful in our duty to Him.

No wonder confirmation is less about a rite on Confirmation Sunday, as valuable as it is,

but is primarily focused on catechesis, the study of God's Word. No wonder confirmation is not graduation, as none of us, this side of eternity, will ever graduate from the temptations of the devil, world and sinful nature, from suffering as a Christian, from false teachers and teachings trying to lead us astray, that is, *from needing Christ*. Yet in our Confirmation vows we promise the very thing we need, remaining faithful unto Christ *by remaining faithful to His Word*. When we are in God's Word regularly, studying it, hearing it, reading it, believing it, living it, the Holy Spirit works in us the endurance we need, that will last to the end. And so enduring in sincere faith in the true Christ, *we shall receive the promise of salvation in heaven's glory*!

God keep us in His Word that we would endure in faith and holiness and so be saved. Amen!
